Performing the Manchester Junior Word List Test (MJWL)

The Manchester Junior Word List, originally devised in 1957 by TJ Watson, was specifically designed for hearing-impaired children from about the age of 6 and upwards. The original words have been revised and now consist of 8 word lists, with each list containing 10 words as shown below.

Scoring the Manchester Junior Word List

The child should repeat the word exactly as they hear it. If they are not sure of the word, they should guess it and if only part of a word is heard, then they should say that part. Present all the words in the list at the same sound level and make a note of the result of each presentation on the results sheet. One point is assigned to each word, and the score expressed as a percentage correct out of 10.
